





Significant differences in agreement at 95% confidence interval between the female and male respondents


Comparatively more respondents from Allahabad and Ghazipur agreed to the statement than other districts



Good quality of education (88.5%)


More individual attention to children (69.6%)

Why a public/ government school?

Cost of education (73.9%)

More individual attention to children (33.3%)


